## PREMIERS READING CHALLENGE

Students from around NSW have been engaging in lots of reading this term to achieve an annual challenge set by the NSW Premier. Students who take on the challenge are asked to read a selection of books that are on an approved list.

K/1/2 students have to read, or have read to them, 30 books.

Yr 3/4/5/6 students have to read, or have read to them, 20 books.

Students register their books online at school to receive credit for any books they read at school or at home.

At the end of the challenge, students who have achieved the set goals receive recognition for a job well done and a certificate to remember their achievement.
