We are thrilled with the way the program has evolved. The children are motivated and producing quality work. We have looked at famous artists. Vincent Van Gogh was very popular.

We have made a school mural inspired by the circles of Wassily Kandinsky.

The children have just completed collages after studying the work of Jeannie Baker. These were photographed and displayed. Feel free to come and look at your child's work which is either on display or kept in their individual Art Portfolio.
