Kyogle Soccer – Season 2016

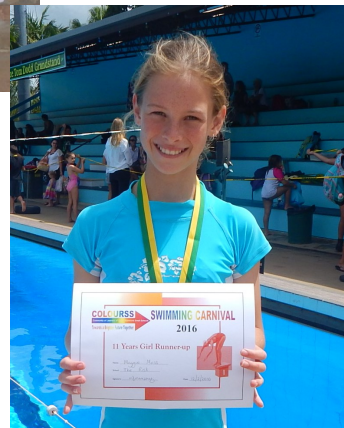
