Expectation: be safe, be respectful, be a learner		
Aim: to create a consistent environment, supporting the learning and well-being of all students to develop in all students the skills required to meet our school's expectations for a safe and fair playground		
Why it is important: to maintain a safe playground, where people can enjoy play time		
Specific Skills to be Taught

Practise or role play idea: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 3 chosen students mime a play situation and others observe the role play and identify appropriate skills 		
Ideas to prompt expected behaviour: PBL expectations on display in buildings, classrooms and other areas of the school. "Examination" reminder posters displayed.		
Procedures for recognising appropriate behaviours: * Acknowledgement * Recognition * Rewards system		Procedures for correcting inappropriate behaviours: Staff having high expectations of all students and consistently following school expectations
