Ideas to prompt expected behaviour: PBL expectations on display in buildings, classrooms and other areas of the school. “All settings” reminder posters displayed.		
Procedures for recognising appropriate behaviours: * Acknowledgement * Recognition * Rewards system		Procedures for correcting inappropriate behaviours: Staff having high expectations of all students and consistently following school expectations
