Safely using equipment

#### Positive examples:

Students waiting in turn to get equipment.
Students moving to appropriate play space to use equipment

**Negative examples**: (only teacher to demonstrate.) Students pushing in and taking sports equipment without waiting.

Students leaving equipment in playground after play.

Students throwing equipment in the door of shed

#### Resources:

Y chart: be safe, be respectful, be a learner/looks like, sounds like, feels like

#### Practise or role play idea:

Class visit to sports shed and practice borrowing and returning equipment properly.

#### Ideas to prompt expected behaviour:

PBL expectations on display in buildings, classrooms and other areas of the school.

"All settings" reminder posters displayed.

### Procedures for recognising appropriate behaviours:

Acknowledgement \* Recognition \* Rewards system

### Procedures for correcting inappropriate behaviours:

Staff having high expectations of all students and consistently following school expectations
