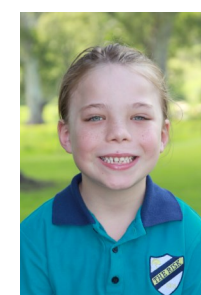


Providing alternative activities during before and after school times has been well received and helps to encourage structured free time for students.
