

Positive examples:

Students will be walking directly in the school
Students walking quietly to the bus

Negative examples: (only teacher to demonstrate.)

Shouting when entering or exiting bus.
Running to the bus and near it
Pushing as entering or exiting bus
Screaming on the bus

Resources:

Y chart: be safe, be respectful, be a learner/ looks like, sounds like, feels like
Bus safety resources

Practise or role play idea:

Lining up and walking to bus
Sitting quietly in bus seats
Keep all food and rubbish in school bag.

Ideas to prompt expected behaviour:

PBL expectations on display in buildings, classrooms and other areas of the school.
"Bus" reminder posters displayed near bus zones

Procedures for recognising appropriate behaviours:

* Acknowledgement * Recognition * Rewards system

Procedures for correcting inappropriate behaviours:

Staff having high expectations of all students and consistently following school expectations
